#### Abstract:

THE ROLE OF LOCAL GOVERNMENT AND SOCIAL CAPITAL IN SUSTAINABLE RURAL DEVELOPMENT: A STUDY ON VILLAGER'S PARTICIPATION The method for the development of the increased social capital through the performance of local government increases the mean of the dimensions of sustainable rural development. In other words, increased social trust in the execution of social-economic plans by local government increases the participation of villagers in the execution of plans, social activities, and economic investment in villages leading to the improvement of the mean of the dimensions of sustainable rural development. Using three villages in Somagede Sub district Banyumas Regency, this study applied a legal research approach and qualitative case study to understand the existing community forces in supporting a pilot project of the rural development area in Somagede Sub district. Informants were purposively selected representing community leaders, village government, young leaders, and village development cadres. The content and structural validity were determined by Item Objective Congruent (IOC) with 5 experts in the aspects of environmental education, psychology, social research methodology and philosophy of self-sufficiency economy. The reliability was determined by Cronbach's Alpha. Reliability of knowledge about environment, awareness, attitude towards environment, behavior towards environment and self-sufficiency economy practice and the whole questionnaire were 0.884, 0.874, 0.893, 0.900, 0.942 and 0.934 respectively. Whether done deliberately or unintentionally, the advantages of this connection occasionally foster and give rise to trust, which endures and is helpful for producing both non-physical and tangible rewards. Sustainable development may be accomplished through the successful learning process of environmental education. Because studying about it aids in understanding how humans and the environment are related and how human actions have an impact on the ecosystem both directly and indirectly. With
